#### A message from Mrs. Denham

I wrote last week thanking you for all of your support over the past few months with our online learning provision, Seesaw and how we will now be starting to give the children access to Microsoft Teams over the next few weeks. Teachers are starting to look into this process with their children.

We do appreciate that it can be hard to change from one platform to the other, especially when it took a long time to get used to Seesaw in the first place. Some parents have asked why we have to change. The Government have funded training for schools in either Microsoft Teams or Google Classrooms and are preferring us to use either of these platforms rather than the ones schools may have used during lockdown. It does make sense to have a uniform way of working so children get used to one of these platforms. They will be used in most schools across the country and in secondary schools.

At school, we are all very busy receiving online training on how to use Teams and the teachers and staff have been amazing at trying to get to grips with this new system. We do understand however how frustrating this may feel for you at home. We are constantly trying to find ways to make this work for both school and home. Our aims are to plan lessons on Teams, send out homework, have lessons and work on it for children who may need to self-isolate and have it as a platform for home/school learning if we ever had to go into complete lockdown again. This form of blended learning is being implemented gradually across the school. The children seem to enjoy it and cope with all the changes well.

Of course, we know that a few families may have IT and internet difficulties with Microsoft Teams and we ask you to email the school and let us know so we can see if we can help in any way.

# After School Care - Wrap around Care.

We are to continue, the wrap around care/after school club, for a **further 3 weeks** as it has been well received by those who have attended. However, after half term to make it viable we are considering offering the care on a **Wednesday** night as well. Could you please let us know **by return of email or by Monday at the latest,** if you would like a place on this extra night. Due to budget restraints we have ensure it is viable and all our costs are covered.

The clubs will run from – 3.15pm to 5.15pm.

The cost is £8.50 per child, per session which **MUST** be paid for on ParentPay before your child attends.

# **Year 6 application for Secondary School**

If you have not yet applied for a secondary school place for your year 6 child, you must do so before the 31st October. The easiest way to apply is online by visiting <a href="www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline">www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline</a> If don't wish to or can't apply online, you can contact the customer service centre on 0345 155 1019 or you can use the copy of the application form that is attached to this email.

Devon is entering into a period now where a lot of secondary schools in Devon will be experiencing growth, so it is essential that they get as many applicants applying on-time. Late applications may be disadvantaged, so it is essential that you make an on time application to give yourself the best chance of securing a place at one of your preferred schools.

### Free Nasal Childhood Flu Vaccination

We have been made aware that a letter is being sent to all parent/carers of children eligible for the flu nasal vaccination. Parents have already started to receive these letters and it is causing some confusion around the process of consent. Please can we reassure you that at this time you don't need to bring this letter and as long as you have completed the consent link provided by Virgin Care Services then your child will be vaccinated at the planned school session.

Any changes to this process will be clearly communicated from the Devon Immunisation Team if/when changes are made.

This is not something that the Devon Immunisation Team have control of locally, it is a national NHS drive to ensure parent/carers of all eligible children are aware of the flu vaccination programme.

# **Free Nasal Childhood Flu Vaccination**

Your child is due to be in Reception to Year 6 from September 2020 and they are therefore eligible for a Free Nasal Childhood Flu Vaccination.

It is anticipated that this will be delivered in schools between October 2020 to December 2020, this will be administered adhering to all up to date Infection Control, PPE and social distancing guidance at the time.

Flu vaccination is one of most effective interventions we have to reduce pressure on the health and social care system which is going to be more important than ever this year. For this reason, it is essential we deliver the vaccine to as many children as possible to prevent the spread of infection to those most at risk in society.

In light of the above we are expecting demand to be high and therefore we urge you to follow the below link to consent to your child's vaccination now. You will also find answers to your FAQ's on this link.
