Forest Schools

Year 2 will need their wellies and warm jumpers next week for our final Thursday afternoon Forest School. It has been lovely to see the children enjoying, learning from, learning in and learning about the outdoors. They have absorbed and been absorbed in the activities we have done.

Saxophone, Clarinet and Flute Tuition (Years 3, 4, 5 & 6)

Children are being offered the opportunity to learn clarinet, flute or saxophone. Instruments can be rented through Babcock LDP Music Service or John Packers of Taunton from as little as £12 per month. Flutes can be purchased new from around £100 and saxophones £200. Lessons are charged at £7.00 per 15 min individual lesson or 30min group lesson (2sharing), £9.50 for 20min individual and £13.50 for 30 min individual lesson. (Saxophone is not offered to year 3). They provide 10 lessons per term. North Devon Cross country at Shebbear College

A huge thank you and well done to the children who represented the school at the North Devon cross country event on Sunday. The weather was appalling with very strong winds and the conditions under foot were very muddy and slippery. Despite the course being relatively flat the conditions made the race a tough one for all competitors. This said the conditions suited our two under 9 boys very well, with Charlie Marshall breaking into the top ten for the first time this season – well done Charlie this places you 12th overall in the race series and Billy Dudden who had his highest finish to date! Our under 9 girls once again put in a fantastic team performance, which means that they are now holding their 6th (out of 15 teams) position comfortably. Even if you have already given details to a primary school, you must apply for a place through the Admissions Team. This is the only way to apply; other forms or lists held by schools will not count.
