# A message from Mrs. Denham

Just to let you know that on Tuesday November 12<sup>th</sup> the school is having its SIAMS – Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools. It is like an OFSTED inspection but it will be especially looking at how we are as a Church school – our ethos, values, vision statement, RE lessons, Collective Worship and so on. The inspector, Mr Mike Graham will be speaking to the children throughout the day and may chat to parents on the playground on Tuesday.

Staff and pupils rewrote Holywell's vision statement back in May. Mrs Jo Andrews, a past parent and helper who works with the children every Friday taking recorders and supporting Wild Tribe, has very kindly illustrated our vision statement. It is a beautiful piece of art work and we have placed a copy in each classroom. Please pop in and see it. We have had banners made too. The children wanted the words Holywell's community not just school on it as they said we were more than just a school – we involve the village, the Village Hall, other schools, other groups and so on. When I presented Foxes class with their own framed vision statement, one pupil said that the community also included the new telephone box book and small toy library! I thought that was a lovely comment.
